Workshops

Trained facilitators will run immersive workshops with students that will challenge and strengthen their world views. The content will be centred around the conference's theme of "The Future of Your Democracy", enabling students to discuss and understand the issues of equality and technology amongst other topics.

Interactive Problem Solving Activity (IPS):

The Conference will feature a simulated Joint Cabinet Crisis where students will be divided into nations and attempt to resolve a constantly evolving hypothetical international issue. This activity enables students to develop their communication and cooperation skills as they attempt to secure the best outcome for their nation.

Speaker Sessions:

Students will have the opportunity to hear from expert speakers in the field, enabling them to expand their knowledge on the topics of radicalisation and democracy.

Model United Nations Debate:

Students will represent a country that sits on the General Assembly of the United Nations and negotiate a resolution with the other countries represented.
